

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP BYLAW

TOWN OF VONDA
BYLAW NO. 03-2010

A BYLAW TO CONTROL THE OWNERSHIP OF ANIMALS

The Council of the Town of Vonda in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be referenced as "The Animal Ownership Bylaw".

2. For the purpose of this bylaw, the expression:


* "even-toed hoofed mammals" shall mean mammals having reduced number of functional toes and that rest their weight equally on the third and fourth toes of each foot – Examples include but are not restricted to pigs, deer, cattle, antelope, camels llamas, sheep, goats, giraffes;


* "odd-toed hoofed mammals" shall mean mammals having a reduced number of toes, each encased in a protective horny sheath or hoof, and the weight is carried mainly by the middle digit of each foot – Examples include but are not restricted to horses, asses, mules.'

*"Municipality" shall mean the Town of Vonda.

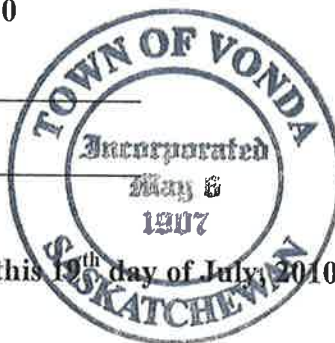
3. No person shall keep odd or even toed hoofed mammals within the limits of the Municipality unless they produce the appropriate documentation showing proof that the mammal is being trained specifically as a serving / guide / or working animal for the blind and mentally or physically challenged.

4. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to a fine of \$250.00
